1. CALL TO ORDER

- The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by President Pamela Meara.

3. PRESIDENT'S TIME

- Ms. Meara asked the 2023 Financial Review Committee to present its report to the board.
- The Financial Review Board consisted of the Chair, Gaynell Kuck, and members David Ralston and Dwaine McCollum.
- Ms. Kuck explained that the committee provided comprehensive documentation of the committee's review
 to support its findings and to provide a strong foundation of knowledge for future review committees. For
 accountability, the committee also identified which committee members reviewed and made the
 recommendations for each of the chapter programs.

- Ms. Kuck said that given the scope of the serious matters raised in the FY2020 Report, the committee found it hard to understand 'at the beginning of the review' why the Chapter leadership had not addressed those matters since 2022 to the present. Ms. Kuck noted that continued failure to address these serious problems could remove legal liability protection from board members and subject board members to liabilities. Ms. Kuck noted that the treasurer and program directors had already implemented some of the above procedures to address the concerns raised in the FY2020 report.
- Ms. Kuck discussed the major recommendations of the committee:
 - The Chapter adopt formal, written, two-person financial process for each program. The program directors should not be the sole person responsible for financial management. The financial management person should report to the Chapter treasurer as the program director does today.
 - The Financial Advisory Committee (FAC) should be tasked with developing an overall Chapter manual covering financial accountability/responsibility/processes to provide consistent guidance and regulations. The manual should be updated as necessary for the Chapter.
 - The Chapter should determine an appropriate threshold for the routine transfer of program funds into the Chapter's bank sweep account.
- The Chapter should provide all past and current reports, along with the treasurer's and range directors' responses, to the FAC for its assessment and its written report to the board. The FAC should follow-up with a written report to the board that identifies which of the FY2020 Report's concerns were resolved and which concerns remain outstanding, along with the FAC's recommendations on any further action to be considered by the board. Mr. Ralston reiterated the need for an updated Chapter manual for uniformity across all programs and ranges, noting that such a document was required by the Chapter's bylaws. He added that when issues are addressed in the future, it needs to be officially reported in another written, official report.
- Mr. McCollum said that in the future, the Financial Review Committee members need more time to discuss operations and issues with the program directors.
- The three Financial Advisory Committee members answered questions about their report from board members.
- The board thanked the Financial Review Committee members for their guidance, extensive level of effort, and the comprehensive report they provided to the Chapter.
- Ms. Meara reported that the Chapter Sponsored GMU Trap Team is the recipient of 20 cases of shotgun ammo and a \$1,000 grant from the Friends of the NRA.
- Ms. Meara said the Chapter's contract with GMU was expiring and asked if there were any objections to her signing a new contract.
 - o Mr. Skipper asked the length of the contract.
 - o Mr. Brino responded that the contract was for one year.
 - o With no objections heard, Ms. Meara will sign the contract.
- Ms. Meara returned to April's BOD discussion concerning the difference between Chapter sponsored
 events and events needing a Facility Use Request. Activities by outside individuals and organizations that
 are not sponsored by the Chapter require the submission of a Facility Use Request prior to the use of
 Chapter facilities.
 - Ms. Meara said that no Facility Use Request was required for a Chapter-sponsored activity, but should always be brought before the BOD. (Air Range coach clinics, Skeet & Trap Clinics, etc.)
 - o All outside entities who would like to use the chapter facilities and are not sponsored by the Chapter must present a facility use request to the BOD.
 - Mr. Skipper asked if any individuals holding instructional classes at the Chapter's Skeet & Trap Range received any financial compensation.
 - Ms. Meara and Mr. Brino said that no individual providing instruction received any funding for their instruction of Chapter members. This is not just at Skeet & Trap but across all chapter programs.

4. MINUTES/CORRESPONDENCE

Minutes from the March, 2025, board meeting were available for all to review. The minutes were approved
as corrected.

5. TREASURER'S REPORT

• Mr. Crisman reported the following Chapter assets as of March, 2025:

 Expenditures: \$179,407.41

Balance Remaining: \$142,160.32
 Total Cash Assets: \$1,253,512

• Mr. Crisman said the Chapter dues were last raised in 2011; individual dues were increased by \$30 and family dues were increased by \$45.

6. MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

• Mr. Crandall said there are 2,116 paid memberships and that he will offer a Membership Office Assistant contract to Cynthia Obregon.

7. SPECIAL COMMITTES

Air Range

 Mr. Kuck said this month there are 14 coaches, from California to Puerto Rico, coming to the Chapter's Air Range to provide instruction.

Conservation

- Mr. Bailey said that the Boy Scouts had conducted a trail and campsite cleanup last weekend and that they offered to rebuild Chapter picnic tables.
- o Mr. Bailey reported that there is a Cub Run Stream monitoring activity this weekend.
- o Mr. Bailey said he had received an estimate for lily pad removal from the pond and that he was considering aeration for the pond.

o Disabled Picnic

- Ms. Meara asked Mr. Hsu to provide an update on the picnic and fishing derby for special needs children and adults.
 - o Mr. Hsu said that the event was scheduled for May 3, 2025, and he expected it to be well-attended by invited guests. He invited all board members to participate in the event.
 - Mr. Hickerson said that trout would be delivered to the pond on April 29, 2025, and that no chemicals would be used in or around the pond before the fishing derby.

Education and Training

o Nothing was brought before the membership.

Field Archery

- o Mr. Riemer reported that the Chapter gun show was a success and had great attendance. He said the range made a profit of about \$2,000.
- Mr. Riemer said that archery qualification for the county's Deer Management Program will begin on April 23, 2025.

o Rifle-Pistol

- o Mr. Crandlemire said that Balco had conducted its assessment and had provided a report with its recommendations to replace the range baffles.
- Mr. Crandlemire said the baffles were installed in 2007, are unstable and losing their rock filling, and will fall down if not fixed.
- Mr. Crandlemire said that without proper funding for the baffle replacement, the Chapter will be forced to close the range.
- Mr. Crandlemire said the report also identified other safety issues, such as constructing a wall behind the range to prevent an accidental firearm discharge into the parking lot.
- o Mr. Kuck spoke to the engineer who worked on the Air Range and the engineer will look at the baffles and provide a proposal to meet Chapter specs. The cost will be \$250/hour and the total cost will not exceed \$3,500.
- o Mr. Crandlemire will get the proposal and bring it to the May board meeting.

Skeet & Trap

o Mr. Brino reported that the Winter League is now completed. and that the Youth Shotgun raffle had concluded, winner was posted in E-Blast.

Target Archery

o Mr. Johnson said that members were participating in archery qualifications.

Youth/Junior Chapter Membership

- Mr. Turner said the Youth Chapter is planning a swap meet for air rifles & pistols and related accessories.
- Mr. Turner said there were 217 Chapter members and that about 180 members had registered for Nationals.

8. STANDING COMMITTE REPORTS

Awards & Grants

 Ms. Meara mentioned the Friends of NRA grant was awarded to the chapter sponsored GMU shooting team.

Bylaws/Policies

o Mr. Phelps said the policy document had been updated.

Buildings & Grounds

- o Mr. Hickerson said that he had tried to get three quotes to encapsulate the asbestos flooring in the Field House but was unable to secure any quotes from businesses he had contacted.
- As a result, Mr. Hickerson proposed that a company he was associated with perform the work for a total of \$20, 409.90. The effort will include all flooring, except for the back porch of the Field House
- o Mr. Hickerson moved that the Chapter award a contract for \$20, 409.0 to Innovative Home to provide all floor covering in the Field House except for the back porch. Mr. Kuck seconded the motion and it was adopted by voice vote.
- Mr. Hickerson reported that during a recent tree removal at the Chapter by a commercial company, the tree fell on a company employee and injured his leg. There is no liability for the Chapter.
- o Mr. Crandlemire said the Liberty safe at Rifle-Pistol will not open and he will use range funds to pay for a locksmith and then seek reimbursement from Buildings and Grounds.
- Mr. Hickerson said tick repellant had been used at Field Archery but there was not enough repellant to use at the campgrounds. It was also noted that tick repellant was needed at Rifle-Pistol.

Elections

Mr. Hsu said that the Elections Committee is accepting nominations for offices until June 17, 2025, with the elections to be held in July.
