Our state of the art indoor range is available for your use anytime a qualified Range Officer is on site. It is common knowledge that a good many regulars in the club are at the range house every morning from approximately 9 am until noon. This is a great time to come down and introduce yourself and find out what Cub Run Archers is all about. If you are new to archery and need advice on anything from bow setup, arrow tuning to shooting technique, not only will you find literally, several hundred years of collective experience, but the equipment to perform those tasks. We especially would like to encourage youth participation and have a great many youth bows that young shooters may practice with to develop their skills. The cost to join Cub Run Archers is only \$15.00 per year, though you don't need to be a member of Cub Run Archers to use the facilities. Remember crossbows are allowed ONLY at the special crossbow station and not at any of the other targets or ranges. A 28 point field archery course is also available for use to all IWLA members. Daytime use only as there is no lighting on the field course. A lighted deer processing station is located between the club house and the practice range with running water. When using this station to process your deer please bring heavy duty plastic bags, dispose of the remains properly, and wash down the area leaving the processing station clean after you finish up with your deer.

The Colonel Birt Kidwell Winter Skeet and Trap League will be forming up soon for the 2012 season. Chapter members interested in participating in shotgun shooting sports and improving their marksmanship skills are encouraged to join. The competitive format provides a demanding challenge for shooters of all ability levels. Shooting the league is also a great way to get to know many of your fellow IKE's. Watershed Conservation Activities

Most of the trash that we pull out of Bull Run throughout the year washes down from the storm drains of area roadways. This Summer however has been a bit of an exception. At the time of our Adopt A Stream Cleanup of Bull Run on August 6th, we encountered very little floodborne trash however it is evident that some recreational users of the parkland along Bull Run are littering with increasing frequency. Nine Chapter volunteers picked up 16 bags of trash from Bull Run in two hours weighing almost 300 pounds. Much of this was in the form of hundreds of glass Corona beer bottles strewn along the stream banks and on the sandbars. If only the State of Viginia had a container deposit we could have made some real money.

At Mason Neck on September 10th, 9 volunteers participated in a shoreline cleanup of the park. We were fortunate to have good weather after the sustained rains during the previous days, which caused so much flooding. We picked up 5 bags of trash and two tires.

The threat of rain seemed to have somewhat dampened attendance of the Adopt A Stream Cleanup of Cub Run on October 2nd, only Chapter members Jay Kahn, Jim Pont and myself showed up, fortunately the sun did shine on us and we were able to pick up 4 bags of trash with a total weight of 84 pounds.

- Passage of the first partial roll-back of Virginia's handgun rationing statute (one gun-amonth). This bill was introduced by VSSA member, **Delegate Bill Janis**;
- Protecting Virginia's gun ranges, making it harder to close a gun range for frivolous noise compliants. Again it was VSSA member Delegate Bill Janis that introduced this bill.
- Passage of legislation abolishing provisions regulating sales and purchases in contiguous states;
- Supreme Court Decisions in Heller vs. DC and McDonald vs. Chicago as a participant in the State Associations' Amicus Briefs; and,

Defeating the Sussex County Planning Department's attacks on local gun ranges.

Members may bring dependents and spouses to the ranges without regard to the on the number of uses, but the member must remain in close proximity and immediate supervision of such family members at all times and members are responsible for the conduct and actions of their family members.

The league will be conducting matches at the air rifle range with our four home teams hosting matches starting in Nov 2011 and continuing through Feb 2012.

Sighting in a New HANDGUN

Well now you have just gotten your Model 501 Super Blaster in the latest 555 Magnum caliber! How are you going to get this new lovely beast shooting right where you want it to?

You should realize that the manufacturer does NOT set the sights on your Super Blaster right where they need to be. There are two models of the Super Blaster: one with fixed sights and one with adjustable sights.

Let's consider the fixed sight version first. At the IWLA Rifle-Pistol Range the closest distance you can place a target it at 25 yards. So buy the biggest target we sell and put it one your target frame backwards so the BLANK side of the paper is showing towards you at the firing line. Put a colored sticker 1-2 inches across at the center of the blank target. Post your target. Come back to the firing line and **SITTING DOWN** fire three shots slowly with your new handgun firmly resting on one of our nifty carpet covered blocks. For each shot carefully aim for the colored sticker. Take your time to get a good sight picture.

Do **NOT** STAND UP! Do **NOT** blast a whole magazine of rounds at the target as fast as you can! Three shots slow and easy. At this point you should have a group of three holes somewhere on the target.

On the same target shoot another three times. Now you should have a nice group of SIX holes grouped together somewhere on the target. Try a third time, shoot three more rounds. And if all goes well you have a group of nine holes on the target. (IF you have NO HOLES on the target at all take the new handgun to a gunsmith for a thorough checkup. Do NOT KEEP SHOOTING this handgun!)

Let us assume that you get nine holes close together on the target. And for explanation sake lets assume the group is level with your colored sticker and approximately 12 inches to the right of the sticker. Cover up the nine holes or mark them with a pen. Now try three groups of three shots again BUT this time aim approximately 12 inches to the left of the sticker. If all goes well you should hit right around the center target sticker.

So now you know how far the point of fire is for that type of ammunition in your Super Blaster at 25 yards. The next thing is to try another brand or weight of ammunition made for the caliber of your Super Blaster. You will be surprised how far a typical handgun can spread different weights and brands of ammunition at 25 yards. You may be able to find a weight and brand of ammunition that you like that shots on or close to the point of aim of your Super Blaster. This is OFTEN the BEST way to get a fixed sight handgun to shoot to the sights. It is a lot less expensive than "pushing" sights, replacing sights, etc. And besides you get the fun of trying out various kinds of ammunition in your new gun!

If not, you may be able to buy a sight pushing tool to move the fixed sights on your Super Blaster IF the manufacturer has engineered the "FIXED SIGHTS" to be slightly movable. If you don't want to invest in a sight pushing tool you can consider having a gunsmith move the sights for you. Bring your target along so he has some idea of how far your sights need to move. Usually fixed sight handguns can move the rear sights left and right to adjust for left-right point-of-aim failures. Up-and-down point-of-aim failures are a bit more complicated and may require a gunsmith to install a new taller front sight if your point of aim is high. If your point of aim is low, the front sight can be CAREFULLY filed down or replaced to raise the point of impact.

Good Luck. SHOOT SAFELY or don't shoot at all!



Information on Renewing your Membership for 2012

- When you receive your **Renewal Notice** in your <u>Newsletter</u>:
 - Fill in <u>ALL</u> of the blanks completely. All of the information must be <u>PRINTED</u> and <u>LEGIBLE</u>. Clearly indicate any <u>CHANGES</u> from last year. If the form is missing critical information (like your current address) or we <u>CAN'T</u> read it, we will <u>NOT</u> process your renewal application but we will send it back to you to be corrected.
 - Make sure the <u>Release Statement</u> on the back of the form is <u>signed</u> (must be signed by both primary and secondary member if Family membership). If the release is not signed, we will <u>NOT</u> process your renewal application but will send it back to you to be corrected.
 - Completed renewal applications with payment are **<u>DUE</u>** by **<u>December 31, 2011</u>**.
 - The Late Renewal period **ENDS** on **March 1, 2012**. Late renewals postmarked after March 1, 2012 will not guarantee you a membership slot for 2012.
 - The <u>Senior</u> rate applies to anyone who reaches the age of 60 on or before December 31, 2011.
 - The **Remote** rate applies to anyone whose residence is more than 50 miles from the Chapter (measured as the "crow flies" not by how many miles you have to drive to get here).
 - Life Memberships are only obtained from IWLA National. You must contact National to apply/pay for a Life Membership. Our Chapter does **NOT** have a Life Membership category but we honor National Life Membership with special renewal rates.
 - If you have worked your extra Eight (8) hours of volunteer work and want credit for your \$50 discount, you must include your signed 8 hour work slip record with your renewal paperwork. If you do <u>NOT</u> include it or it is not signed, we will <u>NOT</u> process your renewal application but will send it back to be corrected.
 - The bottom portion of the Renewal Form is your receipt for the tax deductible portion of your dues. If you don't detach and keep it, we will not keep it or mail it back to you. If you make a copy of the renewal form, please print it double sided.
 - Please do **NOT** tape or staple forms, work sheets, and/or checks together.
 - Include annotations and/or notes explaining any changes to your membership status. The more information you provide us, the less chance we'll have to send your renewal paperwork back to you for correction.
 - If you have not received your new membership card and range sticker within 6 weeks of sending your completed renewal forms with full payment Contact the Office at 703-631-4495. Don't wait months before contacting us.
 - If you have **not** completed your six hours of volunteer work, you will **not** receive your Range Sticker with your new membership card. Once you have completed the six hours of volunteer work, and bring in the completed, signed form to the office, you will receive your Range sticker.
 - If you need an alternate payment schedule, <u>you</u> must bring the request before the Board of Director <u>BY</u> the December BOD meeting on the 6th of December. That requirement is in the Bylaws.
