Field ARCHERY UPDATE

Cub Run Archers would like to extend a warm welcome and an invitation to all members of the IWLA to take advantage of the many facilities, training opportunities, archery equipment, events and great camaraderie that our club has to offer. Our state of the art indoor range is available for your use anytime a qualified Range Officer is on site. It is common knowledge that a good many regulars in the club are at the range house every morning from approximately 9:30am until noon. This is a great time to come down and introduce yourself and find out what Cub Run Archers is all about. If you are new to archery and need advice on anything from bow setup, arrow tuning to shooting technique, not only will you find literally, several hundred years of collective experience, but the equipment to perform those tasks. We especially would like to encourage youth participation and have a great many youth bows that young shooters may practice with to develop their skills. The cost to join Cub Run Archers is only \$15.00 per year, per family. Though you don't need to be a member of Cub Run Archers to use the facilities, we have a monthly newsletter and several dinners and picnics throughout the year and attendance at even one of these would easily be worth the annual membership. The outdoor facilities are available to any member in good standing of the IWLA. We have practice range with target butts at 5, 10, 15, 20, 30, 40, 50, and 60 yards. These are lighted as well if you would like to shoot in the evenings. There is also a crossbow station with a movable bag target for field point shooting and a broadhead target for shooting broadheads. Remember, crossbows are allowed Only at the special crossbow station and not at any of the other targets or ranges. A 28 point field archery course is also available for use to all IWLA members. Daytime use only as there is no lighting on the course.

Shooting Reminder

Only shoot broadheads into a broadhead targets! If you shoot a broadhead into a field point target you may find yourself purchasing that target. If you do not know the difference between the two kinds of target butts on the range please ask someone at the range before you start shooting. These target butts cost IWLA members \$300 - \$350 each. Help us get the most life possible out of each target butt.

Deer Processing Station

For all the IWLA deer hunters who would like to process their own deer, the deer processing station is twenty yards off the Cub Run Deck. The area is lighted with running water from a garden hose located by the deck entrance. You will need to bring trash bags with you for proper disposal of all parts of the carcass. When finished be sure to wash the area down completely putting all remains in plastic bags before going into any dumpster.

Important, please read


"Toxic" Broadheads not to be used at the Chapter Including the Field Archery ranges at any time.

A new broadhead called the Toxic has recently become available, and seems to be selling well in this area for use in deer hunting. While this broadhead may prove to be highly effective for hunting, it is not to be used on any of the Field Archery Ranges due to the damage it inflicts on targets.

A local archery shop reports after approximately 25 shots with this broadhead a brand new target was rendered useless. As these targets cost upwards of \$150 each, there is no way Field Archery can afford to replace targets that normally last months to a year on a daily or weekly basis, to support the use of this equipment.

This restriction is being implemented to protect the facilities property and maintain a safe and functional facility for all members to enjoy.

Below are some pictures for to clarify the specific broadheads in question.



As you can see in the third picture these broadheads do massive damage to targets with each shot.

.Rain or Shine, The Shooting's Fine!

The 2013 outdoor target archery tournament season hosted by the Fairfax Target Archers was the most successful ever.

Our May "Spring Shootout" 900-Round (one-day event), and our August "Virginia State & JOAD Outdoor Championship" FITA Round (two-day event), were both at full capacity with archers of all ages (8 to 70+) participating. In May, we had to overcome the additional challenge of shooting in less favorable weather (intermittent rain all day), but our Outdoor Championship event in August had two days of perfect weather (sunshine and moderate temperatures). And that fine August weather saw some pretty fine shooting too, with 52 new individual distance and overall tournament record scores being set.

In addition, our club hosted weekly 600-Round informal shoots on Sunday afternoons (weather permitting) which allowed a "tournament-like" practice session.

In each case though, all archers got to do what they most enjoy: the challenge of shooting arrows over long distances (up to 90 meters).

In addition to our outdoor events, our club also hosted the Virginia Indoor Championship (also with full capacity attendance) in February.
