



## President's Column

The Chapter went through some changes in 2021. The year started with the Chapter operating under executive orders from the governor of Virginia due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Most of our annual events were held and were very successful. Sadly, we lost some members in 2021, who are always in our hearts.

Keith Pearson, the Chapter caretaker, will not be renewing his contract for 2022. As the caretaker and a Chapter member, Keith put in a lot of hard work to keep the Chapter running the past few years. I want to thank him and wish him all the best in the future. The volunteers at the Chapter have been working to get some much-needed improvements completed.

You may have noticed there were some closures of facilities in December 2021 while this important work was being completed. There were new vehicle sensors installed at the Chapter's front gate to improve gate operation. The floors at the Field Archery field house were replaced along with repairs to the conservation shed, Chapter's small pavilion, and the pavilion at Target Archery in December 2021. We are finally getting some much-needed work completed at the Rifle-Pistol field house. We have refurbished the restroom, relocated the water heater, added new cabinets and a new utility cabinet, along with painting in January. The field house and range roof replacement has also been completed. Additional projects are being planned for 2022. The Skeet & Trap field house is going to be getting some repairs to the ceiling and floors. The Chapter is still in the planning stage for replacing the baffles at the Rifle-Pistol range. There is also the possibility of adding shortrange lane backstops and adding action pistol bays to the Rifle-Pistol range.

In 2022, the Izaak Walton League of America celebrates its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The IWLA is the oldest conservation group in the United States. Our Chapter is 86 years old in 2022, being chartered in 1936. As we look forward to the second century, we must remain vigilant on many fronts. I hope you can find a way to be involved in any way you choose. There are opportunities to be involved at the Chapter, state, or national levels.

The ARL-FX Chapter is the largest chapter in the Izaak Walton League of America and is run mostly by volunteers. Those volunteers give their time at the events and in work parties to contribute to making this Chapter successful. I hope more of you will come out and volunteer in 2022.

We have a great group of volunteers, and it's a great way to get involved. We will keep you all updated on a regular basis with things going on around the Chapter with our main communication methods, the quarterly publication of the Chapter's newsletter along with the Web site and the monthly E-Blast.

# 2022 Chapter Education and Training Program

The Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, Inc., IWLA, Education and Training Program provides students with the knowledge, skills, and attitude necessary for the safe ownership and use of firearms across the shooting disciplines of rifle, pistol, and shotgun. All training events are open to the general public and the tuition is very competitive.

The 2022 schedule of events consists of 25 formal NRA courses and shooting clinics, including basic- to intermediate-level firearms training, ammunition reloading, instructor training, and shooting coach schools. Courses are being offered throughout the year. IF ... you have not renewed yet, chances are your membership slot is still available. BUT ... renew right away or you may lose your membership. Your 2021 range badge will expire soon. Don't be denied access because of an expired range badge.

#### **Membership Notes**

- Renewal update:
  - » As of December 22, 2021, the office staff had received and processed just over 1,150 renewal forms. That leaves more than 1,200 yet to be received. Don't forget ... Any renewals postmarked after December 31, 2021, are late and then in order for you to renew, you will have to pay the "admin" fee of \$40.
  - » Do NOT forget to sign the back of your renewal form. Otherwise ... You will have to come into the office to sign it.

- BE PATIENT waiting for your credentials. We mail in bulk. That means we wait until we can bundle 400 + envelopes together before we take a trip to the post office.
- » Membership renewal forms have been available online and on campus since October.

They are REQUIRED to access all our ranges. Without a current range badge, you will not be able to use the ranges. If you lose your badge, you can get a replacement for \$25 at the office during office hours.

## **Requested Proposed Revisions to Bylaws**

**Purpose & Rationale:** Purpose & Rationale: To update and clarify existing Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, Inc., IWLA, bylaws. Motion made and approved at the Board of Directors (BoD) meeting on December 7, 2021, to modify the bylaws to:

**Article VI (Committees).** To clarify when a Chapter member cannot be a member of the election committee. **Grounds Rules.** Added Range Badge requirements for entire Chapter.

**Rifle-Pistol Range Rules.** Section I, Conditions for Access to the Rifle-Pistol Range. Strike paragraph 9, Wearing **Range Badges.** It is no longer needed as it's now included in the Chapter Ground Rules. Renumber paragraph 10 as 9. These will be voted on by the membership at the February 2022 general membership meeting. Revisions are denoted by **Strikethrough** and **Bold Italic**.

### **ARTICLE VI**

## **Committees** (Page 16)

The President, with the consent and approval of the Board of Directors, shall appoint such standing and special committees as the Board of Directors shall direct. The President shall be an *ex-officio* member of all committees, *except the election committee if they are a candidate standing for election. No Chapter member can be a member of the election committee if they are standing for election.* 

## **GROUNDS RULES**

**General** (Page 20)

Any person using any facility or any portion of any part of the Chapter property shall do so at their own risk and by so doing hold the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter of IWLA, its officers, directors, range officers, agents, and assigns indemnified from any personal injury or other claim.

- 1. **MEMBERS.** Members, their spouses, and dependent children under eighteen (18) years of age may enjoy the privileges of the property, but will be expected to properly identify themselves at any time if requested to do so by Chapter officers, directors, range officers, or any member.
- 2. WEARING RANGE BADGE. Adult Chapter qualified members MUST WEAR the current Range Qualification Badge in PLAIN SIGHT whenever they are shooting at any of the Chapter ranges.
- **3. GUESTS.** Guests will be permitted use of the property only when accompanied by a member in good standing of the Chapter except as hereinafter provided for:
  - a. An individual may be a guest on the Chapter property three (3) times in one calendar year, except for special events or with prior permission of the Board of Directors.

- **b.** The number of guests that each member may bring on to the Chapter property shall not exceed three (3) persons on any one day except with approval of the Board of Directors.
- 4. FAILURE TO OBEY GROUNDS RULES. Chapter officers, directors, and range officers have the authority to expel anyone acting in any way contrary to the Chapter Bylaws, Grounds Rules, and or Range Rules.

## Rifle-Pistol Range Rules (Page 27)

9. WEARING RANGE BADGES. Range Qualified Chapter members and all other Range Qualified personnel MUST WEAR the current Range Qualification Badge on their outer clothing in PLAIN SIGHT whenever they are inside the Rifle-Pistol Range fence. Range Qualified Chapter members must carry their Chapter membership card with them and present it to a Range Officer when requested to do so.

## Wildlife Act Gets Senate Hearing

The Recovering America's Wildlife Act received its first U.S. Senate hearing December 8, when the Committee on Environmental & Public Works took testimony on the bill, S. 2372. The bill would provide a 21<sup>st</sup> century funding model for conserving the fish and wildlife species of greatest conservation need, with funds funneled through state and tribal fish and wildlife agencies.

The bill would redirect \$1.3 billion per year for state wildlife conservation efforts, and another \$98 million per year to tribal wildlife managers. The money would be redirected from existing federal revenue, and the program would provide matching money to state and tribal wildlife agencies and their partners to help implement state wildlife action plans.

In the House, the Natural Resources Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife held a hearing in July on a similar bill, H.R. 2773. The House legislation is cosponsored by Rep. Robert Wittman, a Republican, who represents Virginia's 1st Congressional District (Fredericksburg/east-central VA) and Rep. Donald McEachin, a Democrat, who represents the 4th District (southeast VA). Neither Sen. Mark Warner nor Sen. Tim Caine has yet cosponsored the Senate bill.

The Virginia Wildlife Action Plan identified 883 species that are in decline, along with strategies to reverse their decline. It takes a local approach, dividing the state into 21 regions and developing plans to address local wildlife priorities by conserving the most important habitat in that region. ## **Virginians Cosponsor Ag Resilience Act**

Virginia Representatives Donald Beyer (D-VA-8 in Arlington and Fairfax Counties), Gerald Connolly (D-VA-11 in Fairfax and most of Prince William Counties), and Abigail Spanberger (D-VA-7 in central Virginia) have cosponsored the Agriculture Resilience Act, H.R. 2803. The legislation takes a comprehensive approach to helping make farms more resilient to changing weather patterns, and to reduce the impact of farming on climate change.

The bill includes the League's proposal for a State and Tribal Soil Health Grant Program to help states take the

lead on soil health by developing and implementing statelevel soil health plans. It also includes authority for the U.S. Department of Agriculture to provide a discount on federally subsidized crop insurance for farmers who adopt soil-health practices, which are known to make cropland and grazing land more resilient to heavier rains and longer droughts.

Soil health practices like planting cover crops, conservation tillage, and rotational grazing that increase resilience to droughts and heavier rains should reduce bad crop years for farmers, and thus reduce the cost of taxpayer subsidies for crop insurance that covers their losses. Farmers who use those practices should be eligible for a kind of "good-driver discount" on crop insurance.

Some of the proposals in the legislation to increase funding for USDA conservation programs are addressed in the Build Back Better legislation pending in Congress. That bill includes \$27 billion over five years that would let USDA help more farmers adopt soil health practices like planting cover crops and using more diverse crop rotations. 

## Limited Broadhead Use on Outdoor Archery Range

The indoor and 3-D archery ranges are for **field tip use ONLY,** no broadheads are allowed on these ranges. The
outdoor archery range does provide broadhead targets,
but only on the target butts marked in bright **RED** stating
"BROADHEADS OK."

These target butts are located at the crossbow station and include 20-, 30-, and 40-yard Rienehart (4' x 4' black

target butts). There are also 2' x 2' target butts with **RED dots** that may be used for broadheads, and the **RED** cube dice at 50 yards. In other words, if there is a **RED** "BROADHEADS OK" sign or **RED dots** on the block target butts, these may be used for broadheads. *All other targets are for field tips only*. This includes any 3-D targets that may be placed on the range.

All core-drilling broadheads are strictly prohibited on the Chapter archery ranges. Damage to the target blocks and 3-D animals on the outdoor range has occurred in the recent weeks. There is evidence someone is shooting core-drilling broadheads. Anyone witnessing broadhead usage on these targets, please notify the Archery Range officer or any Cub Run officer.

As stated on the ARL-FX IWLA/Cub Run Archers Web site range rules (Section 11 PROHIBITIONS—https://www.cubrunarchers.org/range-rules.html):

"Anyone observed ... shooting broadhead-tipped arrows at other than targets expressly designed for that purpose will be referred to the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, IWLA, board of directors for disciplinary action."

## **Arlington-Fairfax Chapter Shenandoah County Property Status**

In September, the ARL-FX Chapter board of directors sanctioned the Shenandoah County Property Committee (SCPC) to establish a process where members could access and utilize the property. The property is located approximately eight miles northwest of Strasburg, Virginia.

The property consists of 50 acres that includes a main hollow that runs north to south with an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) trail down the middle. The ATV trail continues beyond the back property line. The left side has four small valleys that run easterly. The rise and fall of these valleys/ hills are roughly 50 yards up and down. On the right side of the main hollow is a very steep hill that climbs 80 to 100 yards. The west side of the property is a sloping grade to the neighboring property which is clearly marked with "No Trespassing" signs. There are no streams or running water on the property. There is a seasonal creek in the middle of the property that follows the main hollow. The property is roughly 300 yards wide by 900 yards long. This is all rough terrain of pines and hardwoods. The only level area on the property is at the front just right of the access gate.

The ARL-FX Chapter Web site was updated and the "request process" went live in late October 2021 and within days we received the first request to use the property. Of course, new processes rarely work as expected right out of the gate, but in this case the process had only a minor glitch which was quickly corrected with an update to the Web site. Turns out hunting seasons in Shenandoah differ slightly from northern Virginia so the seasons were added to the Web site for clarity.

A request can be made by any ARL-FX Chapter member to use the property with up to two additional members or guests. We limit the number of folks on the property to three individuals as to not cause interference with their activities. We also limit a request up to three consecutive days to allow the maximum use of the property among the membership.

To date, there have been twenty-four requests, half being in the month of November. More than half of these requests have been only one or two days. All the requests have been for hunting or scouting the property with a majority for deer hunting. Surprisingly, archery and black powder have each constituted roughly 25 percent of the requests. No harvests have yet to be reported.


The sample size is of course small since this process has just started, but there is interest by the membership


in using the property. The Chapter will continue with this process and reassess the utilization of the property on a periodical basis.

## Ax/Tomahawk Fire Safety Workshop

The Knife Club met on December 12, 2021, for an Ax/Tomahawk Fire Safety workshop at the Chapter. In attendance were six Boy Scouts and their parents, and several couples of Chapter members. Highlights included:

We discussed fire prep fuel gathering (tinder, "penci" twigs, kindling, and rounds), matched up proper tools with each (folders, belt knives, saws, small tomahawks, woodsman axes, and a large splitter), did some guided feather-sticking, and got into safe kindling prep.

The boys learned the acronym C.S.T.S. before chopping ("Chopping Stuff Takes Smarts") which means to Check (around you), get in a good Stance, recheck your Target (before striking), and go Slow (for safety). Several of the boys and some of the

parents practiced their wood chopping skills with small, medium, and large axes. A first-aid kit was available if needed, but not used.

We moved to the fire-prep area and shared numerous fire-starting means —magnesium/flint bars, fire cord, magnifying lens, fire steel with strikers, cotton balls coated with Vaseline, dryer lint, and lighters. Each Scout tried their hand at different fire-starting means, with some parents practicing as well. A fire extinguisher was available just in case, but not used.

Lastly, we moved to ax- and knife-sharpening techniques, which were demonstrated and practiced.




## **Animal Protection**


