

Target Archery Range –

Update for Phase 2/3 (as of August 2020)

***Due to Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic ALL Executive Order (EO) Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) requirements are in effect at the chapter. Masks are required to enter any of the buildings. Please maintain Social Distancing.**

Changes from Phase 1

- Guests are allowed.

As of May 16, 2020 – Phase 1

The target archery range will be open to members in good standing between sunrise and sunset daily. The target archery range is located behind and to the left of the Arlington-Fairfax IWLA chapter clubhouse.

There is no range safety officer (RSO) on duty; however, a range captain may be present, who has RSO authority. The range captain will inspect the range, make repairs, replace target faces, ensure that archers follow the rules, and periodically sanitize targets.

For phase one, no guests are authorized to use the target archery range.

All members desiring to use the target archery range will be familiar with the Target Archery Range Rules (<https://wp.arlingtonfairfax-iwla.org/archery-range-rules/>).

Current range badges must be worn and visible at all times.

Set up and store archery equipment at your vehicle, and not on the benches, gazebo, or picnic tables.

Social distancing (six feet or greater) is in effect at all times, for all archers and spectators, except for family members who live in the same home. Where social distancing is not possible, facemasks are required.

Archers will not share any equipment. The owner of any equipment that is touched by more than one person will wipe it down immediately with disinfectant.

Archers and family members are advised to carry your own hand sanitizer, and to use it upon entering and leaving the target archery range.

Targets are set up on odd-numbered lanes, for recurve archery only.

- One archer will use a target at a time. Two archers from the same family may use the same target at one time.
- Do not shoot across lanes for any reason.
- Do not move any target to a different lane.
- No bows over 60 pounds draw weight will be used on the target archery range.

- Lanes are numbered 1 to 11 from left to right.
- Compound bows under 60 pounds draw weight are authorized on lane #11 only (the lane closest to the gazebo on the right-hand side of the target archery range)

Note: To shoot a compound bow on the Target Archery Range, archer must be certified as a Target Archery Range Safety Officer or be under the supervision of a Target Archery Range Safety Officer while shooting. Any “high draws” will disqualify the archer from use of the range.

A shooting line is painted in orange paint on the range.

- Archers will stand with one foot on either side of the shooting line when shooting.
- Nobody will walk downrange when archers are on the shooting line.
- Archers will not stand on the shooting line when anyone is downrange.
- Archers who have finished shooting will step back from the shooting line at least six feet.
- Anyone can call Cease Fire for any reason, and the issue will be resolved prior to resuming shooting.
- Do not aim a drawn bow above the top of your target for any reason.
- If a range captain is needed for any reason, call or text 571-550-1347.

Do not leave any trash at the target archery range. There is a dumpster in the parking lot as you enter and leave the range.

The nearest facility for bathrooms and washing hands is the shotgun range clubhouse.

- Bathroom waiting line is limited to one person waiting indoors.
- Bathroom cleaning is the responsibility of the person about to use/going into the facility.
- The Shotgun Range Safety Officer will supply cleaning and disinfecting supplies.
