Officer/Director Reports

President's Report

Mark Gauntner reported:

→ There will not be a 201 class for the summer. The next 201 class will start in September.

→ Planning is continuing for a fletching class.

Vice-President's Report

Tom Miller reported:

→ There were five participants at the May 4 shoot. The next shoots scheduled are Summer Sizzler, June 28, and Buck Buster, August 10.

→ The range looks great, and is the prettiest range in Virginia.

Treasurer's Report

→ Arlington-Fairfax IWLA Chapter elections will be held July 5-6, and July 12-13. Mark Gauntner is a candidate for a director position.

Director of Social Activities

Linda Riemer reported that the kitchen will be open for the June 28 shoot.

VBA Representative

VBA representative Paul Vogel gave a report on the VBA.

A member of the VBA, Jacob Atkins, presented the VBA's plan to participate in the Virginia Outdoor Sportsman Show, which will include a 3D shoot. The show is scheduled to be held on August 1-3 at the Richmond Raceway Complex in Richmond. One issue will be the procurement of targets. More information will be given to the Cub Run Archers club.

Director of Field Archery

Director of field Archery Dick Riemer reported:

→ Thus far, 44 have qualified at the range for the county management program. The deadline for qualification is June 22.

→ The 101 class will be held June 22.

→ The Arlington-Fairfax IWLA Chapter Eblast has been sent. The Chapter is hosting a crushing clay event on June 14 to raise funds for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Anyone interested in participating in the event should contact Dick Riemer or Steve Bolinski.

New Business

→ Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources processing classes are scheduled for this fall. The FCDMAP program lead Sgt. Earit Powell pledged support for the CRA classes.

→ Four older 3D targets were placed on the practice range. No broadheads are to be used on these.

→ Plans have been discussed for a possible Crab Feast in July. Bob Walla mentioned that the Crab Feast could also include fried chicken from Popeyes. Bob Walla offered to provide more information at the July meeting.

→ Steve Elkins started a discussion for the club to host a USA state 3D shoot in August, which could be coordinated with the club's Buck Buster shoot.

→ Ladder stands will be removed soon. The stands are unsafe, and have to be fixed or welded many times. They will be replaced with tripods this month.

→ The goal is to build one or two broadhead targets to compliment the new tripod stands.

Old Business

→ Don Early reported that they are waiting for power to be installed at the front gate. The Arlington-Fairfax IWLA Chapter internet is currently down, but will be brought up soon.

Mark Gauntner commented:

→ A Rhinehart order has been placed for the indoor range, and is awaiting delivery to Hoffman Archery. Dick Riemer and Mark Gauntner will co-ordinate pick-up of 155 bricks.

→ Work on revising club by-laws is still in progress.

→ The April 26th work party was a tremendous success. All agenda items, plus a few more, were carried out. Thanks to all who helped.

→ Initial tree removal activity went well. More than 50 trees were marked for trimming or removal. The outdoor range looks great.

→ All ranges are to be inspected as soon as possible. The wait has been to allow the leaves to come out.

→ Plans for the Arlington-Fairfax IWLA Chapter Board to repair the back porch are continuing. There are no plans to upgrade the front deck.

→ Dick Riemer, Director of Field Archery, has approved fees of \$2—same as before--for using Pay Pal to pay club dues. A Pay Pal link will be added to the club web site soon.

→ Membership cards are still in the works.
